

Please read these instructions carefully to enable you to use all the possibilities and advantages of your new dryer. Please note in particular the safety information.

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SAFETY AND SAFETY MEASURES



The enclosed instructions contain important information on the installation, use and safety of your dryer.

Keep them in a safe place for other users or subsequent owners.

- Read the instructions carefully before using the appliance.
- Keep the instructions close to the appliance for further reference.

This appliance meets the stringent safety regulations for electrical appliances.

• Follow the safety instructions in the operating and installation instructions.

Use in accordance with the intended purpose

This dryer is intended exclusively for drying textiles in the home.

The appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and adults with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children must not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance must not be carried out by children without supervision.

Safety during operation and use

MARNING Risk of electric shock

- Do not operate an appliance with visible damage.
- Only touch the mains plug with dry hands.
- Only pull on the plug, never on the cable, as this could be damaged.
- Never spray the appliance with water and never use a steam cleaner.

Repairs may only be carried out by trained specialist personnel and defective components may only be replaced with original spare parts from the appliance manufacturer.

Incorrect repairs or third-party spare parts can cause considerable material damage and danger to the user.

Modifications to the appliance are only permitted in consultation with the manufacturer.

- If the mains connection cable is damaged, replace it with the appropriate replacement cable (available from the manufacturer or customer service).
- Always disconnect the power supply before carrying out maintenance work.
- If the appliance is not to be used for a longish period of time, it must be disconnected from the power supply.

MARNING Risk of fire! Risk of contamination! Property and appliance damage!

The appliance contains the environmentally friendly but flammable refrigerant R 290. Improper disposal can lead to fire and contamination.

• Dispose of the appliance properly and do not damage the pipes of the refrigerant circuit.

- Keep naked flames and ignition sources away from the appliance.
- Always keep the air inlet on the dryer clear.

A WARNING Risk of injury!

If you climb onto the dryer, it may tip over and cause injury.

- Do not climb onto the appliance.
- Do not sit, lean or support yourself on the loading door or the machine.

Reaching into the rotating drum can cause injury to hands.

- Never reach into the rotating drum.
- Wait until the drum has come to a standstill.

When lifting the dryer, protruding components (e.g. loading door, cover plate) may break off.

• Do not lift the appliance by protruding components.

If a drying cycle is ended prematurely, the temperature and humidity of the laundry can cause burns on contact with the skin.

- Ensure appropriate hand protection.
- Remove the laundry quickly and spread it out so that the heat can be released.

If a puddle of water has formed on the floor near the appliance (broken hose or similar), wipe it dry and rectify the cause (see **PROBLEMS**).

A WARNING Risk of fire!

Items containing heat-sensitive substances may ignite when drying.

- Do not dry laundry in the dryer that has been cleaned with industrial chemicals or treated with flammable solvents such as stain removers, white spirit, etc.
- Wash laundry soiled with cooking oil, acetone, alcohol, petrol, paraffin, stain remover, turpentine, wax or wax remover in warm water with an additional amount of detergent before drying.
- Do not dry textiles in the dryer that have been treated with hair remover, nail varnish remover or similar products.
- Do not dry any items in the dryer made of foam rubber (latex foam rubber), shower caps, waterproof textiles, rubberised items or items of clothing or pillows with foam rubber flakes.
- Remove all objects such as lighters and matches.
- Use fabric softener or similar products in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.

Safety for children

MARNING Risk of injury!

Children can get into life-threatening situations or injure themselves when playing with the dryer.

- Children under the age of 3 should be kept away from the machine unless they are supervised at all times.
- Do not allow children to play in, on or near the dryer.
- Activate the child lock if required.

Children can become trapped in appliances and put their lives in danger.

Make disused appliances unusable:

- Pull out the mains plug.
- Cut the mains cable and remove together with the plug.
- Destroy the door lock.

Children can choke on small parts.

• Keep small parts away from children.

Safety during installation

Marning Risk of injury!

When placing the appliance on a plinth, it must be secured in accordance with the installation instructions, otherwise it may tip over or fall.

- Have the appliance installed by a specialist in accordance with the installation instructions.
- Do not connect an appliance with visible damage.
- When installing on top of a washing machine, the dryer must be attached using a tower kit in accordance with the installation instructions.

Observe the following when drying

The appliance may only be operated with fluff filters fitted.

- Never operate the appliance with damaged fluff filters.
- Keep the area around the dryer free of fluff.
- Clean the fluff filters regularly. The heat exchangers can be impaired and destroyed by fluff.

The maximum load is 8 kg of dry textiles.

- Only dry clean laundry in the dryer.
- Before starting a programme, ensure that there are no foreign objects in the drum.
- Keep pets away from the appliance.

A drying cycle should always end with a complete cooling step so that the laundry remains at a temperature that will not damage it.

• If a drying cycle ends prematurely without cooling down, the laundry items must be removed quickly and spread out so that the heat can be released. It should be noted that the temperature and moisture of the laundry can cause burns on contact with the skin. Appropriate hand protection must therefore be provided.

DISPOSAL

Packaging from your new appliance

All packaging materials used are environmentally friendly and reusable. Return the packaging to the specialist dealer or supplier. Dispose of the packaging material properly.

Disposing of your old appliance

Disused electrical and electronic appliances should be collected, recyclable materials recovered and harmful substances (for flammable refrigerant R 290, see safety instructions) disposed of in an environmentally friendly manner. For this reason, an advance disposal fee is levied on every household appliance and charged directly to the end user. This is required by Swiss law.

The advance recycling fee (vRG)


The advance recycling fee is already included in the price of a new appliance.

This contribution is used to finance the current disposal of old appliances. This is why all household appliances can be handed in for disposal free of charge, even if they have not been purchased new.

Your retailer or one of the 400 official SENS collection points will accept used appliances (www.sens.ch or ask your local authority).

An additional fee may be charged for the collection of appliances from households.




- 1 Control and display panel

DRYING

Preparing appliance

- Check that the fluff filters have been inserted (see **DRYING / CLEANING THE FLUFF FILTERS**).
- Switch on the power supply.

Appliance switch-on

- Press **ON/OFF**. After starting up, the main menu is displayed.
- Press the **SCROLL FORWARDS** arrow button to call up additional menu pages.

Opening the door

- Press the **OPEN THE DOOR** button. The loading door springs open.
- The door can be opened manually at any time by briefly pressing at the level of the locking latch.

Selecting the programme

• Select the desired programme by pressing the light bar. The programme is displayed with programme duration, maximum load quantity and selectable options.

Selecting the programme option

The options can also be used to adjust the programme to the specifics of the laundry (see **PROGRAMME OPTIONS** chapter).


- Select the desired option(s) by pressing the light bar or the relevant symbol. Selected options are displayed in colour.
- Press again to deselect the option.

Loading laundry

- Ensure that there are no foreign objects (paper clips, coins, nails, etc.) in the drum.
- Place the laundry evenly in the drum.
- Mix large and small laundry items.

Closing the door

- Press the door shut until you hear the lock click into place and the **OPEN THE DOOR** symbol lights up.
- Ensure that no laundry items are trapped between the loading door and the fluff filter.



Changing programme before the programme has started

- Press the **BACK** button.
- Select the new programme with the options.

Starting the programme

• Press **START**.

Prepaid card / washMaster

For appliances with a payment system, the programme will only start after the payment has been debited (see **PREPAID CARD / WASHMASTER**).

Skipping to the next programme step

 Press and hold the light bar next to FORWARD until the desired programme step is displayed.

Interrupting the programme

- Press and hold the **ON/OFF** button until **PRO-GRAMME STOPPED** is displayed.
- Press the light bar next to **STOP** to stop the programme. Press **CONTINUE** to continue the programme.

Cancelling the programme

- Press and hold the light bar next to **CANCEL** until **END** is displayed.
- Remove the laundry immediately after cancelling and spread it out so that the heat can be released.

Self-cleaning

The self-cleaning function at the end of the programme helps extend the service life of the appliance and achieve good drying results over the long term.

• Avoid cancelling programmes frequently so that self-cleaning can take place.

Caution

Risk of appliance damage

• Do not open the door while **SELF-CLEANING** is displayed.

Adding laundry

- Press the **OPEN THE DOOR** button (**IS NOT LIT!**).
- The programme is stopped.
- Follow the instructions on the display.

Programme end

The programme end is displayed

When crease protection is switched on, the drum continues to rotate at short intervals at the end of the programme (see **SETTINGS / CREASE PRO-TECTION**). The door can be opened.

Removing laundry

- Press the **OPEN THE DOOR** button
- Remove the laundry.
- Clean the fluff filters.

Cleaning the fluff filters

Fibre abrasion (laundry fluff) is produced when the laundry is used, which is released during drying and collects in the fluff filters in the door opening. Clogged fluff filters can impair the drying process.




• Clean filters **A** and **B** regularly.

Cleaning fluff filter A after each drying cycle



Remove inner filter **A** and flip it open.




- Run your hand over the inside of the filter to remove the fluff.
- Replace the fluff filter and ensure that it is in the correct position.

Notice

Under certain circumstances, even supposedly well-cleaned fluff filters can become impermeable due to fine, invisible deposits that remain in the filter meshes.

• Pour some water onto the inner surface of the filter. If this inner surface is not permeable, clean the filter with a fine brush under running water.

Clean fluff filter B daily



• Remove the outer, coarse filter **B** and flip it open.



- Run your hand over the inside of the filter to remove the fluff.
- Replace the fluff filter and ensure that it is in the correct position.


Descale fluff filters

If the coating cannot be brushed away, it must be dissolved with a commercially available limescale remover spray.


• Spray limescale remover onto the entire filter surface and allow it to take effect. For stubborn deposits, you can place a layer of household paper on the filter surface and spray it so that the filter is moistened. Leave the limescale remover to work overnight. Then clean the filter under running water with a fine brush.

Clean fluff filter C daily


Only for machines of the basic types $\ensuremath{\mathsf{MOA0.1}}$ and $\ensuremath{\mathsf{MLA0.1}}$



• Open the service flap.



• Turn the blue locking levers towards each other in the direction of the arrow.



• Pull out filter **c**.



- Remove any fluff that has accumulated on the inside of the filter by hand or with a damp cloth.
- Replace the filter and lock the blue levers again.
- Close the service flap.

Notice

Never operate the dryer with damaged fluff filters!


- Fluff filters are wearing parts and can be ordered as spare parts from customer service.
- The pipes and fins behind filter C are part of the cooling circuit and must not be damaged under any circumstances.

Cleaning the air filter


• Remove any fluff and dust that has accumulated on the inside of the ventilation flap by hand or with a damp cloth.

Clean air filter D once a week


• Open the ventilation flap.




• Remove air filter **D** by pushing it slightly upwards and then pulling it downwards at an angle.



• Run your hand over the air filter to remove the fluff.



• Replace the air filter and close the ventilation flap.



Appliance switch-off

- Press and hold the **ON/OFF** button until the display goes out.
- Disconnect the appliance completely from the power supply if it is not to be used for a long period of time.

The following standard programme (indicated by) is suitable for drying normally wet cotton textiles and is the most efficient in terms of combined energy consumption.

Favourites

Press the symbol buttons to call up the menu for the relevant programme group.

Drying in the basket

Woollens should be moved as little as possible when damp, otherwise they tend to become matted. Sports shoes can damage the drum due to their weight.

Using the basket enables gentle drying without moving individual machine-washable woollen textiles, plastic or artificial leather sports shoes, caps, cycle helmets, stuffed animals, toys, etc.




Basket A for drying shoes and accessories

Insert **B**

for inserting laundry items

Inserting basket



- Insert the feet of the basket into the brackets of the fluff filter.
- Lean the bar against the top.

Notice

• The drum must be empty.

Check the basket before inserting it. Do not operate a damaged basket.

Loading laundry



- Place the laundry loosely in the insert without squeezing it.
- The laundry must not touch the drum. Otherwise it may become jammed and damaged.

Trousers / skirts / jumpers













Sports shoes and accessories



- Sports shoes and accessories (caps, cycle helmets, stuffed animals, toys, etc.) are dried without insert B.
- Pull the tongue of sports shoes far out.
- Remove shoelaces, insoles and heel cushions.
- Place a rolled-up towel in the basket in such a way that a sloping support surface is created. Place the shoes with the heel on the cloth.

Notice


 Only use the basket with the special DRYING IN THE BASKET (PROGRAMME OVERVIEW / DRYING IN THE BASKET) programme.

Pollenclean

This programme can be used to remove pollen from clothes and textiles that have only been worn for a short time and are not soiled.

• Use the special pollen filter instead of the fluff filter A.


Using the pollen filter



• Take out fluff filters **A** and **B**, remove filter **A** and open filter **B** (see **DRYING/CLEANING THE FLUFF FILTERS)**.



 Insert the special pollen filter into filter B as far as it will go.



- Insert the filter combination into the dryer.
- Remove the cardboard hand guard, close the door and start the Pollenclean programme.



- Remove the pollen filter at the end of the programme using the cardboard hand guard.
- Replace fluff filters **A** and **B** and ensure that they are in the correct position.
- Keep the filter and cardboard hand guard in the packaging until the next use.



One pollen filter can be used for ten drying cycles.

• Press a reminder field on the packaging after each use.

Notice

• Only use the special pollen filter for the Pollenclean programme.

The pollen filter is a consumable item and can be ordered from specialised dealers or from customer service.

Mixed laundry

This programme is optimised for drying mixed loads of cotton and synthetics.

PROGRAMME OPTIONS

- By selecting one or more options, a programme can be tailored to the specifics of the laundry.
- Programme options are only active for the duration of the current programme.
- Longer-term adjustments can be made in the settings (**SETTINGS MENU**) and remain active until they are changed again.

Notice

The **ANTIBAC** and **GENTLE PLUS** programme options are mutually exclusive.

Antibac

The **ANTIBAC** option extends the post-drying phase, which can largely kill bacteria.

• Only use **ANTIBAC** on textiles that are not sensitive to temperature.

Gentle plus

For gentle drying of particularly delicate textiles. The temperature is reduced.

Reverse +

By changing the direction of rotation, curling and knotting of the laundry can be avoided and an even drying result ensured.

• Select this option to dry large items of laundry, such as bed linen.

Time preset

 With the **Time preset** option, you can set the start of the programme to a later time and thus adapt it to your individual habits (e.g. to take advantage of the low tariff for night-time electricity).

Notice

Check that the time on the appliance is set correctly (see **SETTINGS/TIME**).

- First select the desired programme.
- Press the light bar next to TIME PRESET.
- Input the date and time for the end of the programme by pressing the light bar (15 min increments).
- Confirm input by pressing the light bar next to **ok** and press **START**.
- The preset time begins. The remaining time until the programme starts is displayed.
- Once the preset time has elapsed, the selected programme starts automatically.
- Press the Start button again to cancel the preset time and start the programme immediately.

Drying +

This option can be used to temporarily increase the degree of drying for the duration of the selected programme.

Notice

To increase the degree of drying in general (for all programmes), the **DRYNESS LEVEL RAISED** function must be activated in the settings (see **SETTINGS / DRYNESS LEVEL RAISED**).

Time

When a time-controlled programme is called up, the minimum programme duration is displayed.

- The drying time can be adjusted to the type, quantity and moisture level of the laundry.
- Increase the programme duration by pressing the light bar next to **TIME** (5 min increments).

Express

For drying reduced laundry loads or single items made of cotton, synthetic or mixed fabrics.

ECO

For the most economical drying when time is not of the essence. Energy savings: up to 10%.

SETTINGS

Your dryer has a default factory setting. You can adjust the settings to your individual requirements during initial operation or later. The settings can only be changed if no drying programme is running.

Notice

Certain settings on your machine can be locked. However, the LANGUAGE (temporary), DATE and TIME functions are always available.

Settings menu

You can find the individual factory settings for your machine in the consumption data in our download center.

The settings described below are not available for every appliance.

Language temporary

A second language can be selected temporarily via the **LANGUAGE** menu.

- Tap the light bar next to the speech bubble. The menu **LANGUAGE** is displayed.
- Select the desired language.

ADDITIONAL MENU PAGES can be opened by pressing the ARROW BUTTONS.

Pressing the button **BACK** in the menu ends the menu **LANGUAGE**.

Notice

This language will remain active until the machine is switched off or goes into standby.

Change settings

• Press the light bar next to the **SETTINGS** symbol. Or

- Press and hold the light bar next to the **SPEECH BUBBLE SYMBOL** until the Settings menu is displayed.
- Select **SETTINGS** by pressing the light bar. The **SETTINGS** menu is displayed.
- Select the desired setting. The **ARROW** buttons can be pressed to call up **ADDITIONAL MENU PAGES**.

Save changes

Press the **BACK** button (or no later than two minutes after the last input) to exit the **SETTINGS** menu.

Any changes made must be confirmed when exiting the menu.

Language

The **ARROW** buttons can be pressed to call up additional menu pages.

• Select the desired language by pressing the light bar.

Date (factory-set)

The date can be set by pressing the light bar (press and hold for fast scrolling). Confirm input by pressing the light bar next to **ok**.

Time (factory-set)

The time can be set by pressing the light bar (press and hold for fast scrolling). Confirm input by pressing the light bar next to **ok**.

Summer/winter time

- On
- Off

The automatic changeover of the time display to summer time can be switched off.

Programme time display

• Duration

The remaining duration of the programme is shown on the display.

• End

The display shows when the programme will be finished.

Display brightness

• 50

The intensity of the backlighting can be continuously adjusted from 20 to 100% by pressing the light bar (press and hold for fast scrolling). Confirm input by pressing the light bar next to **ok**.

Volume signal sound

- Off

The buzzer signal sound can be regulated in 5 levels or muted.

Button sound

The button sound can be switched off.

Dryness level raised

The degree of drying can generally be increased. This affects all programmes until the next time the setting is changed.

If the degree of drying is only to be increased for the duration of a selected programme, select the **DRYING +** option.

Child lock

- Off

The child lock prevents small children from starting, changing or deleting a programme.

Input with child lock activated

- Press and HOLD THE LIGHT BAR AT THE TOP RIGHT (IS NOT LIT!).
- Press the desired button at the same time.

Deleting favourites

- Select the function.
- The deletion of favourites must be confirmed.

Start menu selection

- Standard
- Favourites

You can display your saved favourite programmes directly in the start menu when you switch on the appliance.

Your favourite programmes are visible at first glance and can be selected as quickly as possible.

Crease protection

- 30 min

At the end of the programme, a crease protection phase (loosening up the laundry) can be set for 30 minutes or 6 hours.

Laundry spun

- Normal
- Reduced

The programme time is displayed more accurately if the dryer is adjusted to the spin speed of the washing machine (the normal value corresponds to a spin speed of 1400 rpm).

Appliance switch-off

Settings for automatic switch-off of the appliance:

• Off

The appliance remains switched on at all times.

• On

The appliance switches off when the programme has finished or if no further operations are carried out after the appliance has been switched on.

• Standby+

No function. (Only for appliances with payment system)

• Standby

No function. (Only for appliances with payment system)

Waking up the machine

Press the On / Off button.

Automatic door opening

- Off
- On

When the function is switched on, the door opens automatically at the end of the programme.

Factory settings

The settings can be reset to the default factory settings (delivery status).

• Confirm the reset with **YES**.

All settings are reset.

The saved favourite programmes are also deleted

PREPAID CARD / WASHMASTER CARD

Selecting the programme

• Select the desired drying programme (see **DRYING / SELECT AND START PROGRAMME**).

The display shows the selected programme with programme duration, maximum load, selected options and the relevant programme price.

Starting the programme

 Press START and hold the card close to the washMaster symbol on the control and display panel.

The programme price is debited and the new credit balance is displayed.

The programme starts after the payment has been made.

• Remove the card.

Credit balance insufficient

If the credit balance on the card is less than the programme price, the following message is displayed.

The difference can be paid with a second card.

Loading the card

If this message is displayed, the credit balance must be topped up before the next drying cycle.

Prepaid card

Prepaid cards cannot be topped up by the user alone.

• Please contact the caretaker or the management.

Notice

Topping up prepaid cards is described in the operating instructions for the payment system (No 538 800).

washMaster card

The washMaster card can be topped up by making a transfer into the relevant washMaster account.

Two options are available:

- Use the payment slips provided for a bank transfer.
- Top up the card via the mobile app or pay directly via the mobile app. You can find detailed instructions at: https://help.washmaster.ch. You must register to use the mobile app.

CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE



- Switch off the power supply to the machine before starting cleaning.
- Never spray the appliance with water.
- Do not use a steam cleaner.

Notice

Solvents can damage appliance parts, develop toxic vapours and are explosive.

Do not use cleaning agents containing solvents.

Cleaning the appliance

- Do not use abrasive cleaning agents.
- Never scratch or scrape with sharp objects.
- Clean the housing and control panel with soapy water or a solvent-free, non-abrasive cleaning agent.



Cleaning the fluff filters


See DRYING / CLEANING THE FLUFF FILTERS

Cleaning the filter holder

From time to time it is necessary to remove any fluff that has accumulated inside the filter holder. To do so, use a vacuum cleaner or a cleaning brush.



• Pull both filters out of the filter holder.



- Run the pipe of the vacuum cleaner or the brush around the well of the filter.
- Remove any residual fluff.
- Replace the fluff filters.

Cleaning the moisture sensor

After longer operation, small deposits (lime, fabric refiner) can form on the front inner side of the drum on both sides of the longish moisture sensors. With moisture controlled programmes, this can result in the desired level of dryness not being reached.



• Wipe deposits away with a cloth soaked in vinegar.

Emptying for frost protection or transport

If the dryer is in a room susceptible to frost or is to be transported, it must be completely emptied.

- Start any programme.
- Press the light bar next to **FORWARD** repeatedly until **SELF-CLEANING** is displayed.
- Allow the programme to finish (without crease protection).

Self-cleaning

The dryer is equipped with an automatic self-cleaning function.

At the end of each programme and also during the drying process, if necessary, the heat exchanger is cleaned.

A slight knocking noise can be heard during the cleaning process and the self-cleaning symbol is displayed.

Carry out self-cleaning manually

If you use the appliance rarely or only dry small amounts of washing, it is recommended that manual self-cleaning be carried out from time to time:

- Pull the fluff filters **A** and **B** out of the filter holder (see **CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE / CLEAN-ING THE FILTER HOLDER**).
- Pour 1.5 I tap water into the opening of the filter holder.
- Replace the fluff filters.
- Start the **COTTON CABINET DRY** programme.
- Press the **FORWARD** light bar several times until **SELF-CLEANING** appears in the display.
- Allow the programme to finish (without crease protection).

PROBLEMS

Improper repairs can result in serious accidents, damage and operation malfunctions!

Do not make any changes, manipulations or attempt repairs using tools such as screwdrivers, etc.
